Political efficacy, or the feeling that one has some degree of influence over their political surroundings, is essential for the functioning of a representative democracy such as the United States. Research shows successfully completing a course in American Politics can increase feelings of efficacy in students (Colby et al 2007, Dominguez et al 2017), but do not isolate a specific mechanism that is causing this increase. It is therefore not clear to what extent high impact pedagogical practices can bolster this increased feeling of efficacy (Galston 2001). Some attempts to develop political efficacy have focused on resource intensive projects (Elder et al 2007, DeLaet 2016). My co-author and I examine the ways in which small classroom assignments that require students to directly practice the skills of citizenship can cause students to gain confidence that they can effectively participate in politics. By comparing sections of POL 101 with interactive assignments such as contacting one's US Representative and signing a petition to sections without these elements, we explore what educators can do to foster political efficacy in their Introduction to American Politics courses. The civic engagement assignments we use directly replicate the skills of active citizenship and are not time intensive for either students or educators to implement, making them an ideal tool for cultivating political efficacy. Our research therefore has the potential to identify specific, easily adoptable teaching techniques that can increase student political efficacy without burdening either educators or students.


